















TAKATA MARTINIQUE CAMPAIGN PRESS RELEASE

Fort-de-France, 17 july 2025

As announced on 30 June 2025, the Martinique government and car dealers launched a major island-wide communication campaign on 1 July.

The aim is to inform the public and speed up the removal of the potentially fatal TAKATA airbags still present in around 16,000 vehicles on the road.

As part of the TAKATA action plan for Martinique, car dealers carried out a series of awareness and detection operations in several of the island's shopping centers on July 11 and 12. These operations resulted in the inspection of 1,546 vehicles and the identification of 50 vehicles affected by the TAKATA recall.

Following these field operations, Martinique's dealers would like to emphasise to users that, as part of the TAKATA recall, no consideration is given to whether the vehicle to be secured is insured or not, or whether it has passed the roadworthiness test or not. **Our only priority is to change potentially dangerous airbags and avoid casualties.**

The field systems will be deployed again on Friday 18 July and Saturday 19 July 2025 - from 9.00 am to 6.00 pm.

These devices will enable vehicles fitted with defective TAKATA airbags to be identified directly:

- Hostesses will be on hand at each site to assist users and check their VIN numbers using dedicated digital tools.
- If an affected airbag is detected, the owner will immediately receive an email and a '**Stop Drive**' text message detailing the procedure for securing the vehicle.
- The information will be transmitted in real time to partner dealers so that the replacement can be carried out **quickly and free of charge**.

Martinique's dealers would also like to thank the government and the Prefect of Martinique for the decree requiring roadworthiness test centres to inform users about the risks associated with TAKATA airbags, published on 15 July 2025.

AN EXTREME RISK IN MARTINIQUE:

- Airbags concerned: TAKATA models manufactured between 1996 and 2019
- Risk multiplied in tropical areas
- 1 in 10 potentially dangerous vehicles on the road
- The majority of deaths recorded in France have occurred in the French Overseas Departments and Territories.

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW:

- Appointments are fast and priority
- The operation is free
- TAKATA airbag replacement takes between 30 and 90 minutes
- All approved dealers are supplied with parts.

WHAT IS A VIN?

AND WHERE CAN YOU FIND IT ON YOUR VEHICLE REGISTRATION DOCUMENT?

A vehicle's VIN (Vehicle Identification Number) appears at least on the manufacturer's plate, on the chassis and on the vehicle registration document.

This is a unique number assigned to each vehicle manufactured.

Made up of an alphanumeric sequence of 17 characters, it
enables a vehicle to be identified precisely.

The VIN number can be found at E on the registration certificate.

For old format vehicle registration cards, nthe VIN number is shown in the section Identification number.
